

Sparkling Bridal Shawlette


DESIGN BY NAZANIN FARD USING KREINIK TWIST

This gorgeous trapezoid shawlette is worked from one side to the other. The body of the shawl is worked in Garter stitch. In the first section increases have been done at the edge of the body right before the edging then in the next section the increases are stopped. In the third section decreases are worked until the beginning number of sts are restored. The beautiful reversible edging adds to the beauty of the design.

Level of Experience: Intermediate

Finished Measurements: Wingspan: Approx. 49" (124 cm)

Back length at the deepest point: 20" (51 cm)



Materials Needed:

- Red Heart, Heart & Sole, 70% wool superwash, 30% nylon, 1.76 oz (50g)/ 213 yds (195 m) per ball, 2 balls Ivory # 3115
- Kreinik Twist (3-ply super-soft metallic carry-along yarn, 65% Cupro, 35% Polyester) 2 cones Silver #001
- Knitting needles size 5 (3.75 mm) or size to obtain gauge
- Crochet hook size F (3.75 mm)
- One stitch marker

Stitch Gauge:

18 sts and 18 ridges = 4" (10 cm) in Garter stitch with size 5 needles

Note:

PM: Place Marker

SM: Slip Marker

M1: Knit in front and back of the next stitch.

Sl: Slip 1 with yarn in front

Pattern Stitch

Sickle Edging:

Row 1 (WS): Knit.

Row 2: K2, yo twice, k2tog, k3, yo, k1. (10 sts)

Row 3: K6, (k1, p1) in the double yarn over, k2.

Row 4: K9, yo, k1. (11 sts)


Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: K2, (yo twice, k2tog) twice, k4, yo, k1. (14 sts)

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Row 7: K7, [(k1, p1) in double yarn over, k2] twice.

Row 8: K7, bind off the remaining 7 sts. (8 sts)



Note: The last bound off stitch remains on the needle and will be separated from the other 7 sts by a space. When row 1 is worked the sts are drawn together. Repeat rows 1-8 for pattern.

Instruction

Section 1:

Cast on 10 sts.

Row 1 (WS): K8, PM, k2.

Note: The 8 sts are for the edging and the 2 sts are the beginning of the body of the shawl.

Row 2: S11, M1, SM, work as row 2 of the Sickle pattern. (3 sts on the body of the shawl)

Row 3: Work as row 3 of the Sickle pattern, SM, k3.

Row 4: S11, k to 1 stitch before marker, M1, SM, work as next row of the sickle edging.

Repeat rows 3-4 until you have 82 sts before marker and end of row 8 of edging.

Section 2:

Row 1: Work as edging pattern, SM, Knit across to end.

Row 2: S11, k to marker, SM, work edging.

Work until section 2 is 5" long and end of row 8 of edging. (5 repeats of the Sickle edging)

Section 3:

Row 1: Work as edging, SM, Knit across to end.

Row 2: S11, knit to 2 sts to marker, k2tog, SM, work as edging.

Work rows 1-2 of section 3 until you have 10 sts on the needle.

Last row: S11, k1, SM, k8.

Bind off all sts loosely.

Finishing

With crochet hook, work one row of sc across the top (straight edge) of the shawl then work one row of reverse sc (crab stitch). Fasten off. Weave in ends. Block shawl to size.



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
